Sleep and Settling Translation to Practice

A 4-hour interactive workshop that includes a theory refresher and opportunity to practice the Victorian Sleep and Settling Model of Care in a simulation environment.

Parent Child Interaction (PCI) Feeding / Teaching Scales

Parent-Child Interaction (PCI) Feeding / Teaching Scales is an evidence informed outcome tool that measures the quality of the Parent-Child interaction, which provides further support to enhance the Parent-Child interaction and relationship.

Keys to Infant Caregiving

A research based educational program that provides essential information on infant and child behaviour, including information on cues, states, state modulation and the importance of the feeding interaction.

Ways of Working in Early Parenting

Exploration of evidence-based ways of working with families in the early years that builds parenting confidence and capacity.

Family Partnership Model

The Family Partnership Model is an evidence-informed framework designed for practitioners to be able to work in partnership with families, bringing awareness of the helper skills, qualities and communication skills required to facilitate an effective partnership when working with families.
