AIMS AND OBJECTS OF THE ASSOCIATION

- (1) To safeguard the health of mothers and babies, by the spread of knowledge of the laws of health.
- (2) To encourage the breast-feeding of infants.
- (3) To employ trained nurses, who shall:-
 - (a) Attend certain centres, where not only mothers with their babies can come, but also expectant mothers.
 - (b) Visit mothers at their homes, and help them carry out simple hygienic rules.
- (4) To hold meetings and give organised teaching to women, as opportunity shall arise, and to disseminate such knowledge by every available agency.
- (5) to co-operate with all present or future organisations working for the same objects.

The objects of the Association being to keep infants healthy, sick children are not treated at Centre, but are always referred to their own doctor, or to a hospital.

Eleventh Annual Report

Ladies and Gentlemen,—

In presenting the Eleventh Annual Report, the Council draws attention to the fact that, while its report gives a general survey of the Association's work, each Health Centre publishes its own Annual Report and Balance Sheet, manages its own affairs, and extends the work in its own district.

The Balance Sheet at the end of this pamphlet is for the Central Council and the Training School only.

ADMINISTRATION.

The Council has met every month, and the Executive Committee, consisting of office-bearers, eight members of Council, of whom two at least must be representatives of Municipal Councils, and which is elected annually by the Council to co-ordinate the work, has met at frequent intervals. The finance is controlled by a sub-committee, a Training School Committee, and a medical sub-committee deals with all technical matters in connection with the training of Nurses and the conduct of Baby Health Centres generally. During the year the Constitution was amended to provide that in the election of the Executive the member appointed by the British Medical Association must form one of such Executive.

GENERAL PROGRESS.

At all the Centres the attendances have increased, especially in the country districts. The help and advice given to the mothers for themselves and for their babies is much appreciated.

During the year a beautiful Centre was erected in the Newtown and Chilwell district by the citizens as a Soldiers' Memorial. It was officially opened on August 24th by General Fetherston, and handed over to the Association to be used for the benefit of the mothers and babies of this district. The Legacy Club presented a comfortable garden seat. This Centre is very much appreciated.

The Richmond Council erected a very fine Centre in Church Street, costing £2500. This is very well attended and appreciated by the Sister-in-Charge, as it is easier for the Sister to carry out her work under such pleasant conditions. Another Centre in Richmond, near the Town Hall, is shortly to be erected.

New Centres have been opened in Ringwood, Mitcham, Glen Iris, Ascot Vale and East Kew. There are now 93 Centres, 35 being in the country districts.

Several of the Centres now possess their own motor car, and especially in the country districts they are of the greatest assistance to the Sisters in visiting the mothers who live at a distance.

The Association had its Centre at the Agricultural Show, where the Sisters were able to get into touch with many country mothers.

During Health Week window displays were arranged in Melbourne and North Melbourne.

The Association desires to express its thanks to Messrs. Myers Pty. Ltd., who again generously lent furnishings for these occasions.

NEW RESIDENTIAL TRAINING SCHOOL.

The Training School and Mothercraft Home, on land owned by the Women's Hospital, was officially opened on October 18th by the Lady Mayoress, Lady Morell. It is a very up-to-date building, and in close co-operation with the Women's Hospital. It has accommodation for two mothers and eight babies. Since September, 45 babies (including 10 prematures) and 20 mothers with breast-fed babies have been admitted to the Mothercraft Home. Nineteen Sisters have taken this post-graduate course in Mothercraft, and several have attended for refresher courses.

The building cost £9000, and the Council is delighted to report that there is now only about £1300 owing. It is hoped very shortly that it will be entirely free of debt.

The Council is most grateful for the splendid financial support from the Trust Funds, the Municipalities, and other

friends. The following local Committees most generously helped towards the furnishings:—Box Hill, Heidelberg, Oakleigh, Mulgrave, Moorabbin, Brighton and Shepparton. Contributions were received from Mrs. James Alston, £25; Dr. Constance Ellis, £20; Mrs. J. D. Howie and Camberwell ladies, £53. An amount of £140/12/8 was very kindly donated by the Medical Red Cross Guild for the furnishings of the Babies' and the Premature Babies' Wards. The Sisters of the Association by their efforts contributed the splendid sum of £150 towards the furnishings of the Sister's quarters. The Council is deeply grateful to all these friends for their practical support.

CO-OPERATION.

The Council has again to record the cordial co-operation of other Societies and Institutions. The Sisters continue to attend each Saturday morning at the Children's Hospital, where lectures are given by the Association's Medical Officer. Copies of these lectures are sent to the Sisters in the country districts, who much appreciate this opportunity of keeping in touch with the work of the city.

The Association wishes to express its gratitude to Professor Marshall Allan for the much appreciated lectures on ante-natal work which he has delivered during the year to the Sisters in training.

The Women's and Queen Victoria Hospitals kindly allow the trainees to attend the ante-natal clinics, and this valuable instruction has been of the greatest benefit. The Council realises the utmost importance of ante-natal work.

The Talbot and Willsmere Milk Institutes, Kindergarten Union, Association of Creches, District Nursing Society, Victorian Bush Nursing Association and Benevolent Societies have greatly assisted in the work.

Talks on Mothercraft have been broadcasted throughout the year, and many grateful letters regarding these have been received from country mothers.

Many lectures have been given to members of Mothers' Clubs, Domestic Arts Schools, Mothers' Unions, Girl Guides and country organisations.

Dr. Campbell continues to act as part-time Medical Officer to the Association. Her time is almost entirely spent at the Training School.

INTEREST IN THE ASSOCIATION IN ENGLAND.

Dr. Younger Ross, in July, 1928, attended the National Conference on Maternal and Infant Welfare in London as a delegate from this Association.

There was a large attendance of over 500 delegates, including representatives from countries such as Japan,

India. Burma and Kenya.

The President, Sir George Newman, Chief Medical Officer of the Ministry of Health, in his opening address, stressed the following points:—

- 1. That the activities of the Infant Welfare Centres be extended so as to include the pre-school child.
- 2. There was great need for reducing the Maternal Mortality rate, which in England was practically double that of the neighbouring countries, Holland, Norway and Sweden.
- 3. That a Medical Inquiry be made into every maternal death due to childbirth.

Since the conference the Ministry of Health in England has asked for a medical inquiry in all maternal deaths in childbirth.

Later, Dr. Younger Ross attended two conferences on Maternal Mortality in Westminster. At these conferences were representatives of all bodies interested in mothers and babies in Great Britain, and about 600 attended. The Victorian Bush Nursing Association was quoted as having a low mortality rate, whereas the general maternity mortality rate in Victoria is 5.59.

At all the conferences the opinion generally held was that the most effective way of reducing the number of babies dying in first week of life and mothers dying in childbirth, was systematic ante-natal supervision.

LECTURING SISTER.

The work of the Lecturing Sister has been most successful. Lectures have been given to the senior girls at the following schools:—Manningtree Rd., Hawthorn; Eastern Rd., South Melbourne; Lithgow St., Abbotsford; Peel St., Kew; Cambridge St., Collingwood; Lee St., N. Carlton; Napier St., Fitzroy; Nott St., Port Melbourne; Hornby St., Windsor; Falconer St., N. Fitzroy; Brighton St., Richmond; Burnley, Glenferrie, S. Auburn, Hawthorn West, Westgarth, Thornbury, Victoria Park, E. Kew, and Deepdene.

Lectures have also been given at Richmond, Montague, E. Camberwell, Collingwood and Preston Domestic Arts Schools, Methodist Ladies' College, "Fintona" Presbyterian Girls' Grammar School, Box Hill Girls' Technical School, Essendon High School, Kindergarten Training College, and to Girl Guide Companies.

1632 school girls sat for Infant Hygiene Examination. Of these candidates, 1025 obtained 75 per cent. or over in marks, and were granted the Certificate.

During the year 300 lectures have been given and 145 demonstrations.

In the country districts several of the Centre Sisters give lectures in the schools.

The consideration and interest shown by the teachers at the schools is very much appreciated by the Association.

MUNICIPALITIES.

The splendid co-operation of the municipalities is very much appreciated by the Association. They are always most sympathetic to the work, and have erected many fine buildings to ensure that the work may be carried out more effectively.

The Councillors individually take the greatest interest in their Centres, and are always ready to assist in every practical way.

NEWSPAPER DEPOT.

The work of the Newspaper Depot is being carried on in premises at 599 Little Lonsdale Street, under the management of Miss Cross, and is progressing very satisfactorily. It is a considerable source of revenue to the funds of the Association.

The Council desires to thank the Trustees, Mrs. J. H. Dodds and Cr. J. A. Grant, for their great assistance and interest.

FINANCE.

The Council desires to sincerely thank the Trustees of the Edward Wilson Estate for their very generous donations, which have enabled the Association to maintain its Training School and effectively carry out its propaganda work. The special donations towards the cost of the Training School are much appreciated.

The Trustees of the Alfred Felton Estate have generously assisted the work, and the Council desires to express its appreciation of their much valued assistance.

The Trustees of the H. V. McKay Trust most generously donated £500 to be used for country work and the Building Fund; £250 was also received from the J. C. MacPherson Trust, per A. Moule Esq., and £100 from the H. Veen Estate, per F. Weigall, Esq.
