# AIMS AND OBJECTS OF THE ASSOCIATION



1. To safeguard the health of mothers and babies.
2. To encourage the breast feeding of infants.
3. To equip and maintain a Hospital and Babies Home, and Infant Welfare and Mothercraft Training School, with Model Baby Health Centre for:
  - (a) The special training of Infant Welfare Sisters and Mothercraft Nurses.
  - (b) The provision of education for mothers with a view to enabling them to bring up their children in accordance with modern health principles.
  - (c) The provision of accommodation for the education and care of mothers and babies, especially nursing mothers, and for difficult, delicate or premature babies who may require special investigation and expert care in regard to their rearing, and so that where mothers in poor, necessitous or destitute circumstances are so accommodated and maintained, the Association shall contribute towards their upkeep from its funds received voluntarily for the purpose.
4. To co-operate with School and other authorities in giving teaching to classes of school girls and young women with the view of gaining their sympathy and interest in the proper care and nurture of babies and young children.
5. To arrange for organised teaching to women on the care of the—
  - (a) expectant mother,
  - (b) the mother, and
  - (c) children,and to disseminate such knowledge by every available means.
6. To co-operate with all present or future organisations working for the same objects.

### FORTY-SIXTH ANNUAL REPORT

Ladies and Gentlemen,

In presenting the Forty-sixth Annual Report the Council draws attention to the fact that, while its report gives a general survey of the Association's work, each Health Centre publishes its own Annual Report and Balance Sheet, manages its own affairs, and extends the works in its own district, the Association acting as a co-ordinating link between the various Centres.

The Balance Sheet at the end of this report relates only to the activities of the Central Council of the Association and its Queen Elizabeth Hospital for Mothers and Babies and Infant Welfare Training School.

#### ADMINISTRATION

The Council has met every month. The Executive Committee consists of the office-bearers and twenty (20) members of the Council of whom two at least must be representatives of Municipal Councils, two at least representatives of country centres, and one a member of the Australian Medical Association, and is elected by the Council at the first meeting after the Annual Meeting.

This Committee which co-ordinates the work has met every month.

The Queen Elizabeth Hospital Committee, and a Medical Sub-Committee deal with all technical matters in connection with the training of the Nurses and the conduct of the Hospital and its Baby Health Centre.

Finance is dealt with by a separate Sub-Committee.

#### LADY DELACOMBE

Lady Delacombe, the Association's Patroness, attended the Association's Annual Reunion of Sisters-in-Charge of Centres, and past trainees of the Association in December, 1963, at the Isabel Younger Ross Memorial Hall, and delighted the Sisters present by visiting every table during morning tea to have a word with them all individually.

Lady Delacombe also very graciously consented to officially open the "1964 Doll Pageant" held at the Myer Emporium in aid of the Association's "Queen Elizabeth Hospital for Mothers and Babies and Infant Welfare Training School."

#### OBITUARY

The Council records with deep regret the loss by death of Sir Norman Carson as a Council member. Sir Norman had been a most interested and regular attendant at the Association's Council meetings for very many years. He represented the Alfred Hospital on the Association's Central Council, and on many occasions was instrumental in obtaining financial assistance for the Association's Queen Elizabeth Hospital for Mothers and Babies, and for our Travelling Baby Health Centre when it operated in the Mallee district of Victoria.

## HONOURS

The Council extends its congratulations to two of its Executive Members who were honoured by Her Majesty the Queen during the year—Cr. A. J. G. Sinclair, Hon. Treasurer, and Dr. W. A. Kemp both received the O.B.E. for their work for the community.

## GENERAL PROGRESS

The Association, as the major Voluntary Infant Welfare Organisation in the State of Victoria, continues its work of establishing new Baby Health Centres and extending the scope of existing ones.

The Association also continues its interest in promoting legislative reform necessary for safeguarding the health of women and children, and stresses the definite need for increased funds for the development of all maternal and child welfare work, with its valuable objectives of saving infant life, the prevention of ill-health amongst young children and encouraging mothers to have, and rear, the healthy children so much needed by the nation.

The Association, as a representative organisation, affords the vital link-up of municipal and public interest in infant welfare work throughout the State that is so essential to the movement and its progress.

The Council of the Association is formed of representatives from the Municipal and Shire Councils, their Baby Health Centre Committees, and from other kindred societies interested in the welfare of women and children, and actively concerned with its actual promotion. Unity is strength, and such a link-up with a central organisation gives strength to this movement, since it creates the organised public opinion and interest that all progressive movements need in a democratic community.

Many Councils and Baby Health Centre Committees are interested and effective in promoting infant welfare work in their own districts, but it is only when they are linked up by representation in this Association that they can combine to form the necessary public opinion for promoting all measures for safeguarding the health of the mothers and babies, and their sphere of influence in this work is widened by contact with others similarly engaged.

One trusts that as the Baby Health Centre movement develops in this State, and Commonwealth as a whole, that nothing will be allowed to militate against the strength and unity of the Voluntary Infant Welfare Organisations, which have been responsible, not only for playing the vital part of pioneering this movement, but in maintaining its general progressiveness during the many years of its development, facts which are frequently forgotten.

The tremendous value to this movement of the work and interest of the Ladies' Baby Health Centre Committees formed to assist Councils in the domestic management of their Centres cannot be too strongly stressed.

Not only has the work of these committees been responsible in the first place for the establishment of the Centres in their district, and for stimulating the interests of their Councils in the project but they have been largely responsible for the subsequent development of the work, and for obtaining for the sister the necessary equipment, and facilities for her work.

The best results in Centre work and their general running eventuates when Councils have such Ladies' Committees with whom they work in close co-operation.

## THE YEAR'S ACTIVITIES

There are now 470 Centres affiliated with the Association.

New Centres have been established at Box Hill, Clarinda (Oakleigh), Forest Hill (Nunawading), Caulfield, Park Orchards, Donvale, Panton Hill, Heytesbury, Cowangie, Walpeup and Underbool. The last three centres were formerly served by the Association's Travelling Baby Health Centre in the Walpeup Shire.

New Centre Buildings have been officially opened during the year at Bennettswood (Box Hill), Orrong Road, Elsternwick (Caulfield), Donvale, North Balwyn (Camberwell), Malvern, Forest Hill, Bendigo North, Tooradin, Euroa, Loch, Yea and Mount Dandenong.

Centres visited by the Hon. Secretary during the year to give talks, attend Annual Meetings, or for the official opening of new Centre Buildings were Emerald, Kilsyth, Ouyen, Charlton, Sea Lake, Malvern, Caulfield, Mount Dandenong, Romsey.

Mrs. Rivers Dickinson represented the Association at Annual Meetings of the Centres at Montrose, Croydon, the Lilydale and Croydon Pre-School Association, and various other meetings in the Croydon district.

Dr. Officer gave a talk on "Home Safety and Accident Prevention" to the Moorabbin Presbyterian Women's Association, and was Guest Speaker at the Baden Powell Pre-School Centre, and at the Seymour Pre-School Annual Meeting.

The Association prepared special posters on "Home Safety and Accident Prevention" for display at the Home Safety Convention held in June, 1964, by the National Safety Council in conjunction with the National Council of Women in Victoria. Dr. Officer, Hon. Secretary, represented this Association on the Organising Committee for this Convention.

Dr. Officer also attended a Seminar held at the Mayfield Centre, organised by the Hospitals and Charities Commission, on "Accident Prevention and Safety" in hospitals and other institutions.

The Association's leaflet for the "Guidance of Baby Health Centre Committees" was revised during the year, the revision being carried out by Dr. Officer for the Association in conjunction with Dr. Wilmot, Director of Maternal and Child Welfare, and Miss M. McDowell, Chief Infant Welfare Inspector.

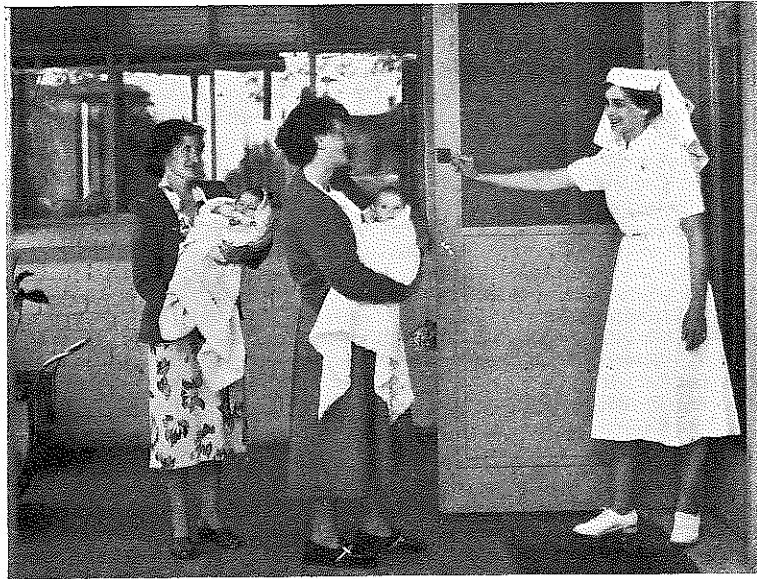
Dr. Officer acted as one of the judges on the play value of toys entered for the "Toy of the Year" Competition this year, arranged by the Australian Toy Manufacturers' Association.

## WORK OF THE BABY HEALTH CENTRES

The work being carried out by the Baby Health Centres continues to increase and more demands than ever are being made on the Sisters' time and services to the community. This fact is becoming increasingly recognised by Councils and their Committees, and consequently additional Infant Welfare Sisters are being appointed to their Centres to cope with the extra work.

Many Councils are also providing better transport facilities for their Sisters to help them to attend new Sub-Centres and to assist the mothers in their homes. This will conserve the Sisters' valuable time for the actual work of advising mothers, instead of much of it being wasted through inconvenient methods of transport.

The Baby Health Centre movement provides the most extensive system of parent education at a very reasonable cost to the community. Of all services provided for the mothers it is one that comes most intimately in contact with them, both through the mothers' regular attendances at the Centres and by the extensive system of home visiting, which is part of the Sisters' work.

Advice at the Centres covers that given to expectant mothers, and the baby from 0-5 years of age (i.e., up to school age).

The work carried out at the Centres by the Sisters is not only invaluable in its preservation of precious infant life and its prevention of avoidable illness, but it helps the mother in the establishment of sound family life, by teaching her the "art of motherhood".

**Dental Examinations.**—The need for the extension of dental examination and treatment for children attending Centres is urgent, especially in country districts.

Colac provides dental inspection for the children attending the Centre. This has been in operation for many years, and has been possible through the co-operation and help of the local dentists. Other country towns could well follow this lead.

Melbourne, South Melbourne, Prahran, Brunswick and Essendon City Councils have established pre-school dental clinics in their districts in connection with their infant welfare centres, and other Councils we hope will develop similar services.

**Ante-Natal Care.**—Care of the expectant mother and advice to her on all points of general hygiene and diet has always been a feature of Baby Health Centre work. Extension of such care has been carried out for some years now by the establishment of ante-natal clinics in connection with Baby Health Centres under special medical supervision.

Such clinics have been established in many Municipalities.

An extension of this work is particularly desirable since it saves the mother both time and fatigue in travelling and the over-crowding of the ante-natal clinics at the hospitals, with whom the Centre ante-natal clinics work in close co-operation.

**Pre-School Facilities.**—Many new Baby Health Centres incorporate in their plans provision for indoor and outdoor playing spaces for

toddlers. Suitable toys and equipment also provide demonstrations to parents of what is required for the development of children at different age levels.

Some Baby Health Centres are combining Pre-School facilities in conjunction with their centre buildings.

**Parent Clubs.**—Parent Clubs have been established in connection with some Baby Health Centres. Such clubs are primarily educational in object, and form a valuable means of furthering the knowledge of parents in all matters connected with the upbringing of their children.

It is hoped that other Councils and their Committees will consider the establishment of Parent Clubs, or the arrangement of special lectures for parents.

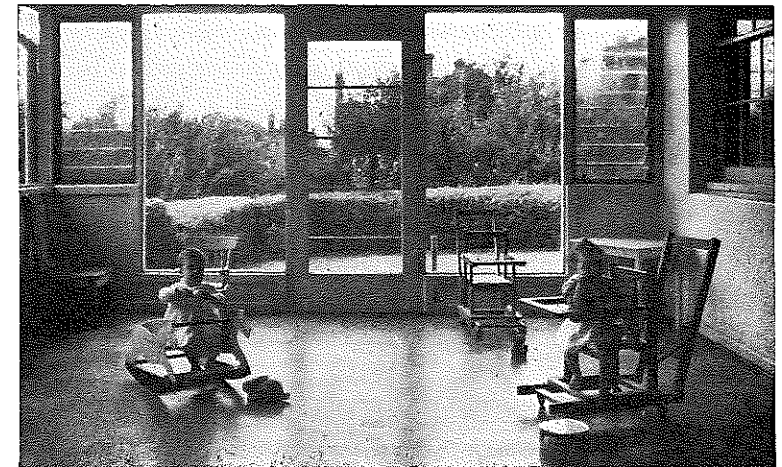
**Libraries.**—Many Centres are incorporating libraries of suitable books for the use of the mothers; a lead that other Centres could follow with advantage. Lists of suitable books and where to obtain them may be had on application to the Head Office of the Association.

**Immunisation and Vaccination.**—Councils continue to carry out immunising against diphtheria, whooping cough and tetanus, and immunising against poliomyelitis, for children attending the Centre, or living in their districts. Such immunisation programmes, together with vaccination against smallpox, are safeguards to the children's health, which Sisters-in-Charge of Centres should encourage all mothers to take advantage of.

**Home Safety and Accident Prevention.**—This is another sphere that Sisters in charge of Centres throughout the State have special opportunities of teaching the mothers and so reducing the mortality and incidence of the crippling injuries that may result from lack of thought in promoting "Home Safety". As our Infant Welfare Sisters are given special training in this subject during their Infant Welfare course, and 90% of mothers with young babies attend Baby Health Centres, the Sisters have the best opportunity of anyone in teaching "accident prevention".

#### PROBLEMS AFFECTING MOTHERS

**Municipal Home Help Scheme.**—The Councils who have established Home Help Schemes in their districts are making a valuable contribution to the health of women and children.

To relieve the constant dread which hangs over the mother of a young family, as to who will care for the children should she fall ill, or even during her confinement, we need a **MUCH greater extension of all existing Home Help Schemes.**

Good "Personnel" for staffing "Home Help" services is our prime necessity, and many more of such personnel are required for this service.

#### INFANT MORTALITY RATE

In 1963 the Infant Mortality rate in Victoria was 18.5 per 1,000 live births, an encouragingly low figure — but slightly higher than the record low of 17.8 per 1,000 achieved in 1961.

#### "BABY HEALTH" QUARTERLY MAGAZINE

The Association has continued the production of this Magazine during the year.

The magazine has now been in production for over sixteen years, and favourable comments are constantly being received in regard to it from readers in Victoria, in other Australian States, and from overseas readers.

The Association values the interest of the firms, who support the production of the magazine by the insertion of advertisements. The Council is grateful to all its regular subscribers and those Committees who guarantee to sell a certain number of copies each issue.

An increase in the number of regular subscribers would be welcomed, as this ensures the financial stability of the Magazine.

#### VOLUNTARY HELPERS

The Council thanks the Voluntary Helpers of the many Baby Health Centres for the regular time they give each week to help the Sisters-in-Charge of Centres. This help is very greatly appreciated; it would be extremely difficult for the Sisters-in-Charge of busy Centres to give adequate time in advising mothers without this assistance of weighing the babes and carrying out other helpful Centre duties.

#### THE QUEEN ELIZABETH HOSPITAL FOR MOTHERS AND BABIES

The year has been a particularly busy one. At our present building it has been possible to double our former training functions in Infant Welfare and Mothercraft and to almost quadruple the residential care given to Nursing Mothers, and to the many delicate frail little infants, including premature ones, who are referred to this institution from all parts of the State, and further developments of the work of the hospital is being considered and planned.

A total of 580 mothers and babies admitted during the year.

**Nursing Mothers' Wing.**—In this wing mothers not only receive help if experiencing difficulty with natural feeding, but are taught the care and management of their infants.

Many mothers are transferred to the Queen Elizabeth Hospital for Mothers and Babies for extra rest and care from the Maternity Hospitals. All mothers who have been in residence have expressed their appreciation of the wonderful help given to them, and their delight that there is such a place for them to come to for rest, care and alleviation of their difficulties.

Highly successful results with breast feeding are being achieved through the work of this section of the institution.

**Infants' Hospital Section.**—In this section skilled attention is being given to premature, frail and delicate babies—little babies who would rapidly go downhill if they did not receive this expert care often required for long periods. They leave the hospital as bright, bonny babies with a firm hold on life. An increased number of babies referred from the Social Welfare Department have been taken into residence for specialised care.

**Training Functions.**—Training of Baby Health Centre Sisters and Mothercraft Nurses is an important work of the Queen Elizabeth Hospital for Mothers and Babies. These highly trained Nurses take skilled advice to countless mothers all over the State.

**Infant Welfare Trainees.**—Thirty-eight (38), Sisters were trained in Infant Welfare during the year. A total of 1,219 Infant Welfare Sisters have been trained by the Association since the inception of this Movement in Victoria.

Twelve (12) Infant Welfare Sisters have been given Special Refresher Courses in Infant Welfare during the year.

The following prizes have been awarded during the year—

The Council congratulates the winners of these prizes on their success.

Eight (8) Mothercraft Students are in residence for the fifteen months Course in Mothercraft.

Seven (7) Mothercraft Nurses completed their training during the year.

During the year Tongala Milk Products Pty. Ltd. have very generously made a sum of money available to the Association to provide a "scholarship" each term to assist an infant welfare trainee with her course. This has been greatly valued by those selected for this scholarship each term. Holders this year have been:

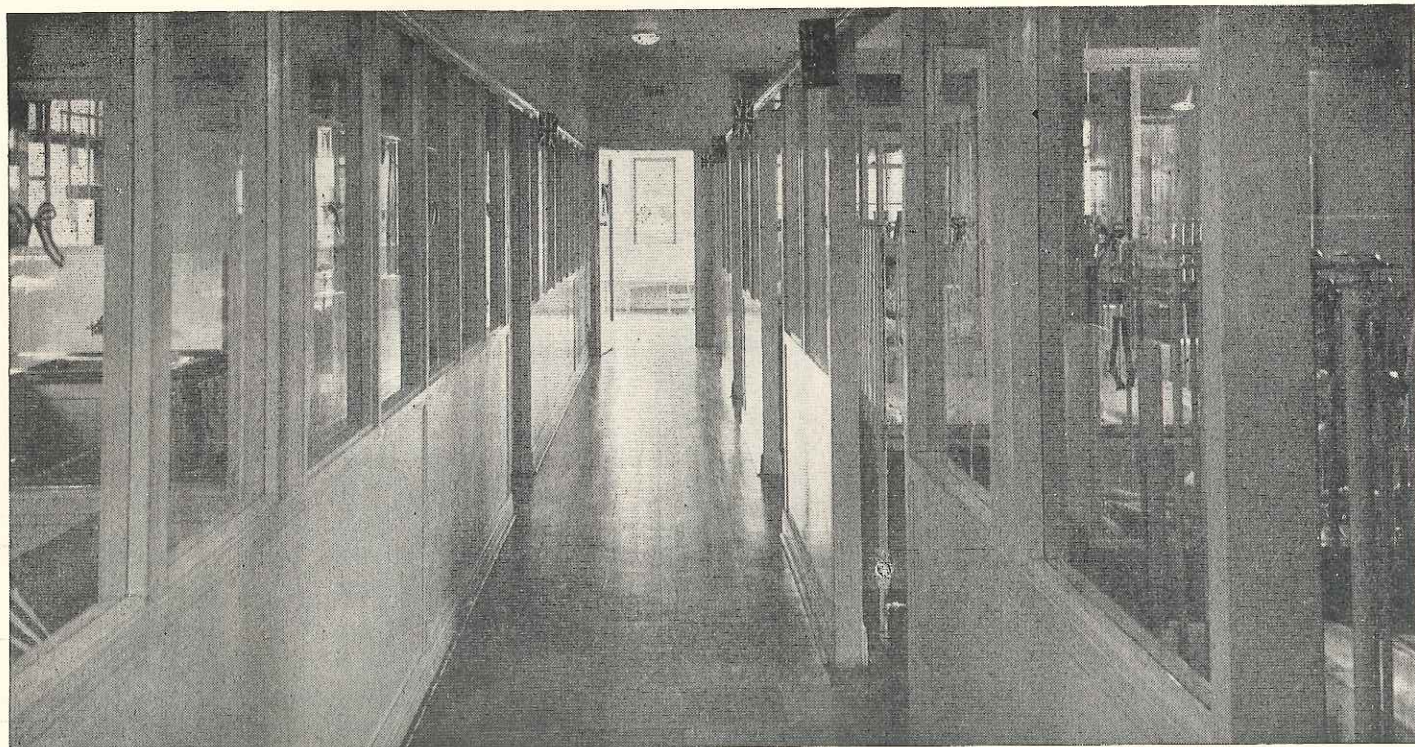

Dr. Rae Matthews resigned during the year as Lecturer to the Infant Welfare and Mothercraft Nurses on account of her marriage and leaving Australia to live in Hong Kong. Dr. Clare MacKinnon has been appointed as Lecturer in her place.

The Committee is also grateful to Dr. Nigel Gray, Deputy Medical Superintendent of the Royal Children's Hospital for the time he gives to lecturing on Infectious Diseases, and to Dr. Roy Cash, Senior Dentist to the Melbourne City Council, for his special lectures on "Dental Care", and also to Dr. Newton, of the Maternal and Child Welfare Department, who lectures on "Home Safety and Accident Prevention."

During the year Dr. Officer lectured to the Infant Welfare trainees on the Child and His Family, and the Management of Young Children and the Handicapped Child.

Dr. Ruth Walker looks after the Mothers and Babies in the Nursing Mothers' Wing, and Dr. Margery Wadds conducts a weekly clinic to trainees in the Baby Health Centre, and is also Assistant Paediatrician to the Hospital.

Dr. Marcia Robinson continued her lectures on "Pre-natal Care" to Infant Welfare trainees during the year.

Dr. T. Seward has continued his lectures on "Preventive Dentistry" to trainees and to Mothers in residence, or attending the Baby Health Centre.

Special Lectures on the pre-school child are given by Miss Stubbs of the Maternal and Child Welfare Department, and visits to the "Lady Gowrie Centre" are paid by trainees.

Nursing lectures and demonstrations are carried out by Matron and her Nursing Staff.

Dr. Doris Officer continues to give lectures on "Public Speaking" to the trainees.

The Council appreciates the work carried out by the Medical Officers and Lecturers, and the time they devote to this work.

The Council very much values the excellent manner in which the Matron, Miss E. M. Buxton, the Assistant Matron, Sister G. Stott, and the Nursing Staff carry out the work of the Hospital, and to ensure its smooth running. Mothers constantly express their warm gratitude for all the help and care they receive at the Hospital.

The Council records its appreciation of the work during the year of its Honorary Medical Officer to the Staff of the Hospital. The Council values the time that Dr. Helen Byrne gives so generously to this work.

The Council appreciates too the loyal and efficient work carried out during the year by all members of the domestic staff. The smooth running of the domestic side of the Hospital contributes so much to the successful running of the Hospital.

The Council values Mr. J. Stenning's work as general handyman—and the many services he carries out for the Hospital and the "Isabel Younger Ross Memorial Hall".

Improvements effected by the Committee at the Hospital during the year included the repainting of the Domestic Staff's bedrooms, bathrooms, Domestic Staff dining room, kitchen, scullery and vegetable room.

The bedrooms in the Mothercraft Students' wing were also repainted, and work is proceeding in repainting the bedrooms in the Infant Welfare Trainees' wing. New and attractive uniforms were supplied to members of the Domestic Staff.

## QUEEN ELIZABETH BABY HEALTH CENTRE

This Centre gives daily advice to many mothers living in the vicinity, and visits are also paid to the homes of the mothers.

The Sister-in-Charge is not only responsible for the routine running of the Centre itself, but also for the practical training of the Infant Welfare Trainees in Centre work.

The Council is grateful to Sister Love, the Sister-in-Charge, for her excellent work during the year.

#### ISABEL YOUNGER ROSS MEMORIAL HALL

During the year the Hall has again been in demand for various functions and conferences.

The monthly lectures for Infant Welfare Sisters from all over the State, which are arranged by the Maternal and Child Welfare Department, are held in the Hall, and the monthly lectures arranged by the Association and given by Dr. Kate Campbell, are also held at the Hall.

The attractiveness and excellent facilities at the Hall have been appreciated by all who have used it, and special delight and comment have been expressed on its excellent acoustics.

#### LECTURING SISTER

The past year for Mothercraft Lectures has proved most successful.

The percentage of certificate awards was excellent, and the number of passes and failures were small compared with the number of students receiving lectures throughout the year.

Two prizes were awarded by the Association at the end of the school year for the best project books — one being allotted to a student at Pintonna Girls' School, and one to a student at Moonee Ponds Central School.

Many expressions of appreciation of the Mothercraft Lectures given have been received from headmasters and headmistresses, and principals of the various schools, and from the girls themselves.

A total of 2,192 girls received Mothercraft Lectures during the year. Certificates issued, 2,063; Passed, 54; Failed, 75.

At many of the schools more than one class is given, some schools being given up to five classes.

The Council has very much valued Sister Burgess's work as Lecturing Sister and the interest she takes in it.

#### LECTURES IN MOTHERCRAFT COUNTRY DISTRICTS

In addition to the Lectures in Mothercraft supplied to Schools in the Metropolitan area, many Sisters-in-Charge of Baby Health Centres in the country have given lectures in their districts to senior school girls.

The Association congratulates these Sisters on carrying out this splendid educational work in addition to their routine Centre work.

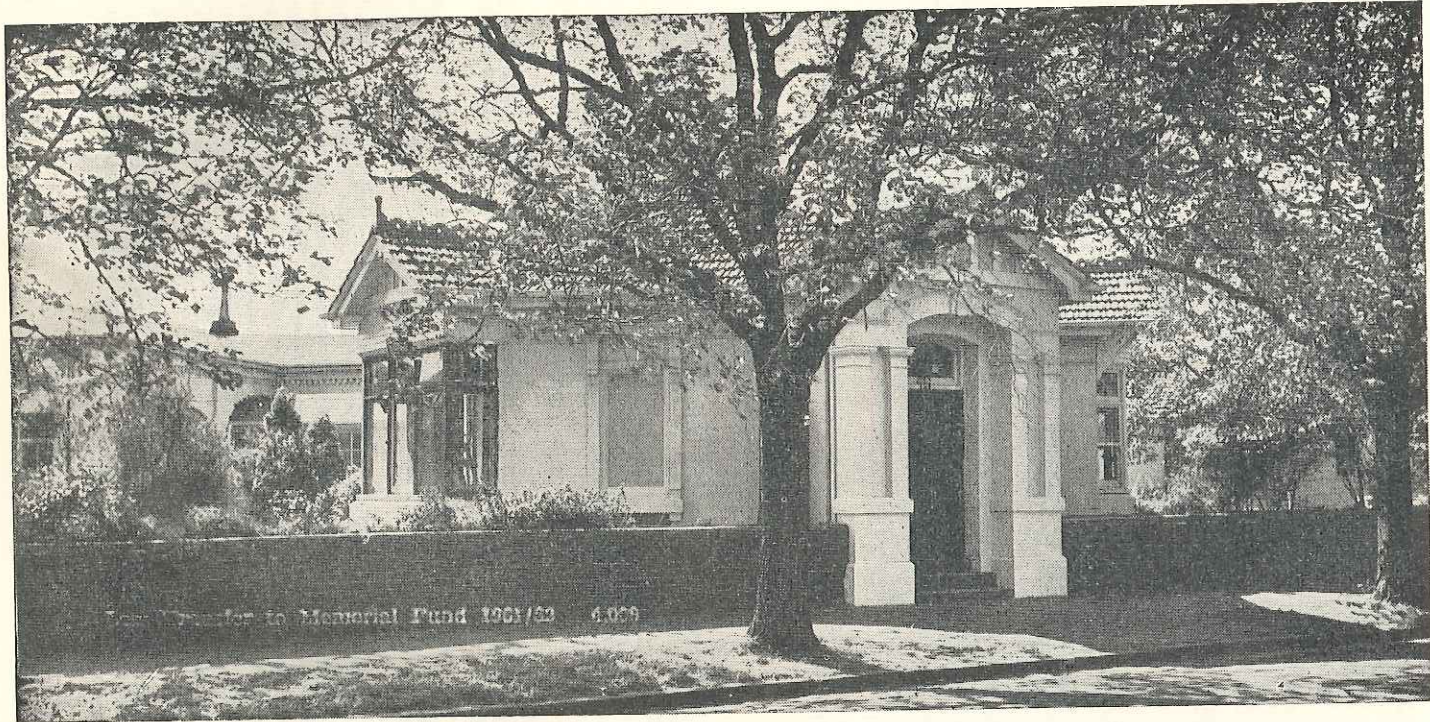
#### STATE GOVERNMENT

The Government subsidy now paid to Municipalities with Baby Health Centres amounts to £750 per annum for each full-time Sister employed, and proportionately for each part-time Sister.

The subsidy towards the erection of Baby Health Centre buildings is helpful and encouraging to local effort in raising funds for such buildings. The subsidy is now on a 2-1 basis up to £3,000.

The Council values the Government's continuance of the special grants to its Queen Elizabeth Mothercraft and Infant Welfare Training School. **In view of increased costs occasioned by rises in salary rates and award conditions, over which the Committees responsible for running such institutions have no control, a much higher rate of subsidy is imperative if these institutions are to continue to function with any measure of freedom from financial anxiety.** These grants have only been increased, since 1946, by £1000 shared between three Infant Welfare Training Schools.

The subsidy towards purchase of cars for Sisters in country districts, and the allotment of a grant towards their maintenance and depreciation is a very valuable contribution towards the success of Baby Health Centre work.

## MUNICIPAL AND SHIRE COUNCILS

Municipal and Shire Councils continue to take an active interest in the Centres and in the extension of this Service in their districts. The Councils have been responsible for the erection of many fine buildings. Further ones are contemplated in many districts as soon as funds and the Government subsidy are available. Councils are frequently helped by funds raised by their Baby Health Centre Committees in erecting their buildings, and many Committees have quite large sums in hand for this purpose, **and the Association's Central Council has assisted many Committees with grants towards the equipment of new centres, or for extending the work in existing ones.**

Councils bear all the maintenance costs of their Centres, and the cost of the Sister's salary, aided by the Government subsidy of £750 for each full-time Sister employed, or proportionately for those employed part-time. The award rate for Infant Welfare Sisters is now £22/3/6, with an additional payment of 17/6 per week if required to use any certificates or certificates other than (a) a General Nursing Certificate, (b) an infant welfare certificate.

A uniform allowance of 8/- per week is also payable under the award.

Some Councils provide cars for their Sisters' use in visiting and travelling between sub-Centres, or give a "car allowance" if a Sister uses her own car for her work.

In many country districts, especially those unserved or sparsely served by train or bus services, a car is a necessity for the Sister to facilitate her transport from one Centre to another to carry on her work in part-time Centres, or to save her time when visiting the mothers in their homes.
