AIMS AND OBJECTS OF THE ASSOCIATION



1. To safeguard the health of mothers and babies.
2. To encourage the breast feeding of infants.
3. To equip and maintain a Hospital and Babies Home, and Infant Welfare and Mothercraft Training School, with Model Baby Health Centre for:
 - (a) The special training of Infant Welfare Sisters and Mothercraft Nurses.
 - (b) The provision of education for mothers with a view to enabling them to bring up their children in accordance with modern health principles.
 - (c) The provision of accommodation for the education and care of mothers and babies, especially nursing mothers, and for difficult, delicate or premature babies who may require special investigation and expert care in regard to their rearing, and so that where mothers in poor, necessitous or destitute circumstances are so accommodated and maintained, the Association shall contribute towards their upkeep from its funds received voluntarily for the purpose.
4. To co-operate with School and other authorities in giving teaching to classes of school girls and young women with the view of gaining their sympathy and interest in the proper care and nurture of babies and young children.
5. To arrange for organised teaching to women on the care of the -
 - (a) expectant mother,
 - (b) the mother, and
 - (c) childrenand to disseminate such knowledge by every available means.
6. To co-operate with all present or future organisations working for the same objects.

THE 54th ANNUAL REPORT

The Committee of Management presents to Contributors the 54th Annual Report and Financial Statements for the year ended 30th June, 1972.

The year under review highlights the growth and development of the Hospital, for the new Mothers' Wing and Nursery building will be completed this year and it is aimed to equip this new wing with all necessities to enable the opening to be held early next year.

The activities of the Queen Elizabeth Hospital have been carried out in the old premises in the existing grounds since 1951, and to cope with ever increasing demands on its services in nursing mothers and babies and to maintain its important place as a link in the Victorian Baby Health Centres Association movement, the new Hospital wing is urgently needed and will provide up to date equipment and modern amenities.

The existing premises will continue to provide accommodation for the Matron - Miss E. Buxton, her Staff, and all trainees. The kitchen will continue to serve patients in the new Mothers' Wing by means of a covered way, but provision has been made in the Food Preparation rooms for Nursery babies.

A review of the activities of the Hospital during the past 12 months is now presented.

PATIENTS

A good intake of patients was maintained during the year and the Hospital continues to care for State Wards under 5 years old. The nursing staff give these children the love and care so necessary to their health and growth.

NURSING

Three fully trained Mothercraft Nurses have been appointed to the staff to enable Infant Welfare Trainee Sisters to be rostered 9 - 5 pm with week-ends free. They were previously rostered between 6 am and 10 pm. This brings the Hospital into line with other training schools, and enables the Sisters to devote more time to study.

HEALTH CENTRE INSTRUCTION

Mothercraft Nurses now attend the Health Centre at the Melbourne University Family Club and receive further instruction in Pre-school child experience. Members of Committee recently inspected this Health Centre and they were most impressed with facilities and the training programme.

Approval was received from the Melbourne City Council Medical Officer for Infant Welfare Trainees to receive Centre work experience at Carlton Gardens, Newry Street, Powlett Reserve and Pigdon Street Infant Welfare Centres.

RESIGNATION

It is reported with regret that Sister Pippard has resigned from the Queen Elizabeth Hospital Baby Health Centre as Sister in Charge. Sister Dudley has been appointed to fill this vacancy and the Committee wish her every success.

AWARDS

The Dr. Doris Officer Scholarship valued at \$150.00 was awarded to: Sister Bouchier, Sister Dudley and Sister Forman.

This scholarship is awarded to a Sister in the three training courses each year, the selection being made by a Committee appointed by the Australian Paper and Cardboard Appeal.

The Margaret White Prize given to the Infant Welfare Trainee considered the "Best in the Year" and valued at \$50.00, was awarded to Sister Catherine Jones.

Sir Herbert and Lady Olney Prize valued at \$6.30 for the Infant Welfare Trainee considered "Most Suitable for Baby Health Centre Work" was awarded to Sister Jones also.

The Committee congratulates the winners on their success.

THE HONORARY MEDICAL STAFF

The President, Dr. E. Turner, and her Committee meet regularly each month and submit reports which are of great assistance to the Committee of Management. A fund has recently been started by them to help assist any sick babies who are in need of special care and whose parents are unable to pay fees. A cheque for \$100.00 was received from the Rotary Club to be the nidus of this fund followed by a further cheque for \$200.00. The Committee expresses their sincere appreciation to members of the Rotary Club.

FAMILY PLANNING ASSOCIATION

Due to lack of space in the Health Centre, Thursday nights have been discontinued by the Association and clinics are now held only on Monday nights and Tuesday mornings. A letter expressing their appreciation of the Hospital's assistance and co-operation was received from the Secretary.

THE ISOBEL YOUNGER ROSS HALL

The larger hall has been in great demand and continues to be most popular for conferences, lectures and displays. During the year, the Australian Institute of Archaeology held a most interesting display with lectures and this attracted large crowds.

The smaller hall has been re-painted and the curtains renovated. It is now reserved for use as a Board room and Lecture Hall for Infant Welfare Trainees. A number of sectional tables have been bought for use in this hall. These will serve as a Board Table and enable Trainee Sisters to record notes during lectures. The old shed in the Hospital grounds was demolished to make room for more parking space for hall bookings.

APPRECIATION

I wish to record my appreciation of all the support given me by my Committee in making so successful the various functions held during the year, and in particular Mrs. B. Harper, Mrs. E.D. Beaurepaire, Mrs. A. Whalley, Mrs. J. Metzner and Mrs. D. Deague for the great effort and hard work involved; also Mrs. Lillian Frank for arranging an opening of a Men's Hairdressing Salon and donating all the proceeds to the Hospital Building Fund; and Mrs. Arden, the Mayoress of Caulfield and the Caulfield Ladies Committee for contributing a further amount towards furnishing a play room in the new Hospital. It is noted that \$1,385.50 has now been received for this purpose. The Committee would also like to thank the Young Lions' Club for their wonderful service in painting the Nurses' Sitting Room and making it look so fresh and new.

AUXILIARIES

The Pied Pipers Auxiliary held a luncheon at the Old Melbourne Motor Inn towards the Hospital's needs and a dinner dance was held at the Mitre Tavern. The Committee would like to record their sincere thanks for all the hard work involved by this Auxiliary and their continued support.

The Birralee Committee continues to work untiringly to contribute funds to the Hospital. An amount of over \$4,000.00 has been raised towards this appeal and the Committee of Management record their sincere thanks to these girls. Christmas Cards are always in great demand and the Birralee Committee had to increase their order this year to meet the many requirements. These can be purchased from Mrs. Cameron and all proceeds from the sale of these are donated to the Hospital.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

The Committee of Management would like to thank the Government of Victoria, the Commonwealth Government and the Hospitals and Charities Commission for financial assistance and Dr. Lindell and his associate Commissioners for their help and advice on various matters during the year. We thank the Melbourne City Council, Municipal and Shire Councils, the Wastepaper and Cardboard Committee, the many Trusts and all the Contributors who have continued to give their valued support.

The assistance given by Messrs. Moule, Hamilton and Derham, the Hospital's legal advisors is much appreciated. Finally we thank the Staff and all who have helped the Hospital during the year.

We look forward to a continuance of this support to maintain and develop the Hospital's services for mothers and babies in need of special care, and the guidance of mothers in caring for their babies, for as the World Health Organisation says,

"The price of health is infinitely less than the cost of sickness".



PRESIDENT

REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT OF THE HONORARY MEDICAL STAFF

Outside medical circles, the unique role of the Queen Elizabeth Hospital in successfully managing the multiple problems associated with disordered infant nutrition, is relatively unknown. At this Hospital there is an unrivalled standard of meticulous observation of the signs and symptoms associated with malnutrition, and a remarkable devotion to detail of nutritional services to the infant which has time and time again succeeded in transforming a woeful, chronically malnourished infant into a contented, thriving baby in a matter of weeks. Often the child has spent perhaps months undergoing diagnostic investigations in one or another of the larger, better scientifically equipped paediatric centres of the metropolitan area, but yet in spite of this, continues to fail to thrive.

Those of us of the medical staff who have watched numbers of these transformations occur at the Queen Elizabeth, have often spent prior months of frustration trying to work the same "miracle" in other institutions. Thus we realise that this noteworthy saving of lives of many infants must be due to the quality of nursing care maintained in this institution. This means the nurse-patient ratio must be very high indeed, higher than that attainable in paediatric hospitals where the pressure of coping with the problem of scientific medicine and surgery, and the anxieties entailed in dealing with acute life and death situations may tend to make the baby who is just not gaining sufficient weight, a less urgent problem.

Our nurse-patient ratio is high because of the invaluable service given by approximately 12 double-certificated nursing sisters, who are employed in the work force, entirely without pay, while they receive instruction to enable them to sit for and obtain their Infant Welfare Nursing Certificate at the end of 4 months.

The Queen Elizabeth Hospital is the only Infant Welfare Training School where trainees function as a necessary part of the work force, and although there are occasional complaints from the Trainees about long hours and no pay, there are never complaints about the value of this practical experience which must contribute to the hospital's reputation for the regular production of some of the finest and most successful Infant Welfare Sisters in the State, if not in Australia. In fact, as one travels around this enormous land of ours, one meets Queen Elizabeth trained Sisters in charge of infant nutrition, in outback areas, in aboriginal mission stations, in new and growing areas of population, as well as in paediatric centres in cities in other states.

The members of the newly constituted Honorary Medical Staff (who held their own first Annual General Meeting at the hospital on July 4th, 1972) give freely of their time to instruct these trainees, and also the Mothercraft Nurses in training, and to guide and direct the nursing staff in its management of medical problems, and as well are "on-call" at all times, both night and day for phone consultations or emergency calls. These latter are infrequent as very sick infants are not nursed in the hospital. However, at most times there are "at risk" infants, such as those with congenital heart disease, congenital malformation of spine, kidneys, skeleton, etc. who frequently have problems which require medical advice.

During the year the Medical Staff urged the appointment of three trained Mothercraft Nurses, to improve the work load and hours of the Infant Welfare Trainees, and thus bring this hospital more in line with other Infant Welfare Training Schools. They are also hopeful of obtaining, in the near future, a Nurse Educator or Tutor Sister to co-ordinate the training programmes.

During the last few terms, Dame Kate Campbell requested leave from her task as chief lecturer, in order to complete revision of the book "A Guide to the Care of the Young Child". On request, a number of doctors from other hospitals and training schools have willingly given their time freely to undertake these lectures. To these doctors the Medical Staff are most grateful, as the work load on the members of the Honorary Medical Staff is often very heavy, and must be carried in addition to the work of a personal medical practice and other hospital or university commitments.

During the year, the staff became concerned about the non-admission of certain babies of uninsured or indigent parents, as they believed that these infants were more in need of the special Queen Elizabeth care, than some of the infants of wealthier, or insured patients. Some of our members approached various Service Clubs about this problem and we are pleased to report that financial support has been given to the formation of a fund to be used to ensure that these needy babies are admitted. The Medical Staff would like to record a special vote of thanks to the members of the Rotary Club of Brunswick, by whose aid this fund has already been established.

The Staff has regular meetings in the evenings at the hospital, at which medical and nursing problems are discussed. At the conclusion of each Infant Welfare Training School, a spokeswoman for the trainees is invited to the meeting to make a report. From these discussions, extra lectures at other Infant Welfare Centres, with Social Workers and other doctors, have been arranged. Dr. Margery Wadds also has acted as the Medical Staff representative on the Committee of Management, and we are most appreciative of her liaison work between these two bodies.

The Medical Staff would like to thank the Committee of Management for advice, support and co-operation during the year and is hopeful that in the coming year there may be some opportunities for more direct communication between the members of both bodies.

In particular, we of the Medical Staff are grateful to all the members of the Nursing Staff for their devoted service to the difficult, disturbed and nutritionally sick infants and their parents, whom we send for admission in the firm belief that after a few weeks of Queen Elizabeth care, these infants will be put successfully on the road towards greater health and happiness.

MATRON'S REPORT

Throughout the year the Hospital has been quite busy, and it is gratifying to find our work is so appreciated by the parents whose babies we have been able to help. We have had babies from country areas and even as far afield as Mount Gambier, from where a small premature baby with a cleft palate was admitted for care in preparation for operation.

The State Wards in our care, 10 in number, are growing up and needing kindergarten equipment. There have been several adoptions during the year.

Sister Pippard has resigned from the Health Centre and her place has been taken by Sister Penelope Dudley. The mothers have greatly appreciated the helpful advice given to them by Sister Pippard.

The pre-natal clinic has been less well attended this year, due to the greater facilities in the bigger hospitals. The family planning meets for two sessions weekly. We are pleased for them to have the use of our facilities.

There have been fewer changes in the trained Nursing Staff this year. All are working very happily. The Infant Welfare Sisters have benefited by the changes in their rostered hours of work, thus having more time for study. Sister Jones and Sister Bodkin gained distinction in the State Examinations. The appointment of three Mothercraft Staff nurses has made possible the improved rosters for the student Sisters.

The Mothercraft nurses are attending the Melbourne University Family Club Kindergarten for their pre-school experience. We are very pleased with this arrangement and the students are receiving good experience in a happy atmosphere. These students continue to attend St. Georges' Hospital for experience in Breast Feeding Training.

We have been very happy to receive two pieces of electrical equipment - a bottle brush and an automatic boiler - which have proved most successful.

We are looking forward to the completion of the new Hospital.

LECTURING SISTER TO SCHOOLS

During the year lectures were given to twentyeight schools. The number of pupils has increased in the larger schools and in many cases the classes are particularly large. A total of 650 lectures were given to a total of 1840 pupils. Attendance was good and interest evident in all schools, and the standard of work particularly high. Conduct was satisfactory. The Principals of schools have been most co-operative. Fathercraft lectures were continued in one school only - Auburn Central school now being reduced in status to primary pupils only.

Some senior boys are desiring co-ed classes and with the Principals' permission I would like to include this in the course next year whenever practical. In conclusion, my thanks have been expressed to Nestles, Johnson and Johnson, The Dairy Industry and the Home Service Department of the National Safety Council. Their literature has been most helpful to the students.

INFANT WELFARE CENTRE

The Health Centre has continued to provide a community service to Carlton. Through centre visits or telephone consultations we have served mothers with babies from other areas as well. During the year the Family Planning Clinic has given help and advice to those who avail themselves of this twice weekly service.

In the Centre the trainee Infant Welfare Sisters are given ample opportunity to see at first hand the problems confronting mothers in and around Carlton. Social work continues to be a major importance, and there is constant communication between The Queen Elizabeth Health Centre and the various Agencies who help, particularly the Melbourne City Council's Social worker - Mrs. Higgins, and her assistant Sr. Brain. Immunisation is well attended. The free dental services are usually accepted by the mothers for their children. The Professorial Unit and Dr. Wadds give a very valuable contribution to families and the trainee sisters in the clinics which are held frequently.
