AIMS AND OBJECTS OF THE **ASSOCIATION**

- (1) To safeguard the health of mothers and babies, by the spread of knowledge of the laws of health.
- (2) To encourage the breast-feeding of infants.
- (3) To employ trained nurses, who shall:-
 - (a) Attend certain centres, where not only mothers with their babies can come, but also expectant mothers.
 - (b) Visit mothers at their homes, and help them carry out simple hygienic rules.
- (4) To hold meetings and give organised teaching to women, as opportunity shall arise, and to disseminate such knowledge by every available agency.
- (5) To co-operate with all present or future organisations working for the same objects.

The objects of the Association being to keep infants healthy, sick children are not treated at Centre, but are always referred to their own doctor, or to a hospital.

Twelfth Annual Report

Ladies and Gentlemen,-

In presenting the Twelfth Annual Report, the Council draws attention to the fact that, while its report gives a general survey of the Association's work, each Health Centre publishes its own Annual Report and Balance Sheet, manages its own affairs, and extends the work in its own district.

The Balance Sheet at the end of this pamphlet is for the Central Council and the Training School only.

ADMINISTRATION.

The Council has met every month, and the Executive Committee, consisting of office-bearers, nine members of Council, of whom two at least must be representatives of Municipal Councils, and which is elected annually by the Council to co-ordinate the work, has met at frequent intervals. The finance is controlled by a sub-committee, a Training School Committee, and a medical sub-committee deals with all technical matters in connection with the training of Nurses and the conduct of Baby Health Centres generally. GENERAL PROGRESS.

The attendances at the Centres have increased, and it is very satisfactory to note that in all the Centres, especially in the country districts, more individual babies have attended. It is also most gratifying that the Sisters are getting into touch with a greater number of expectant mothers, as the Council fully recognises that the whole success of the movement in its endeavour to safeguard the health of the babies, depends upon the care and attention given to the expectant mother, and the value of this antenatal work cannot be overestimated.

The Richmond City Council has erected its second Centre building in Church Street, near the Town Hall. The work since its inception has been carried out in a room in the Town Hall, and the provision by the Council of this efficient and well equipped Centre is very much appreciated by the Sister and the mothers.

A beautiful new building has been erected in East Kew. and was opened in June.

The Shire Council of Lilydale and the ladies of Croydon have erected a charming Centre at Croydon, which is to be officially opened in July. The Ladies' Committee is to be congratulated on their successful efforts to provide this new building for the mothers and babies.

Caulfield Council has appointed a fourth Sister, and is erecting its third Centre building at Ormond. This new

building is to be officially opened in August.

The City of Ballarat, in conjunction with the adjoining Shires, has decided to appoint a second Sister, and is now awaiting the Government grant.

The Moorabbin Council is to be congratulated on its new Centre building, and Sister is very grateful to work

under such pleasant conditions.

The new Centre building at Maryborough is almost completed, and will be ready very shortly. The Committee has done splendid work in its efforts to erect its own Centre building, which will be very much appreciated.

New Centres have been opened at Port Fairy, Coleraine and North Essendon, and several Centres are ready to open

when the Government subsidy has been granted.

Several of the Centres possess their own car, which is of the greatest assistance to the Sisters in the country and outlying districts, enabling them to visit the mothers who live at a distance.

The Committee at Bairnsdale has collected and purchased its own car, which is to be handed to the Shire Council to be used by the Centre Sister. The Council will

pay for its upkeep.

The Geelong City Council has unconditionally given a grant of £625 towards the erection of a Centre, and also granted permission for its erection, subject to the approval of the Government, in the reserve in Hopetoun Park. The Ladies' Committee raised £467, and the building will shortly be commenced.

The Association had its Centre at the Agricultural Show, where the Sisters were able to get into touch with

many country mothers.

The Association desires to express its thanks to Messrs. Myers Pty. Ltd., who again generously lent furnishings for this occasion.

TRAINING SCHOOL AND MOTHERCRAFT HOME.

The Council has the greatest pleasure in reporting that the work at the new Training School has been most successful. Miss Kerville was appointed Matron in November. and the Council thanks her for the splendid manner in which she has carried out her duties. The Mothercraft Home has accommodation for two mothers and eight babies. During the year 62 babies (including prematures) and 27 mothers with breast-fed babies have been admitted. Twenty-four Sisters (four trainees of the Victorian Bush Nursing Association) have taken this post-graduate course, and

several have attended for refresher courses.

It was the idea of the Association in seeking the cooperation of the Women's Hospital, that being in such close proximity, medical students and obstetrical nurses might have the opportunity of attending the School. This desire has been realised, for the Council has been pleased that, in co-operation with the University, the Medical students have received practical instruction in infant welfare from Dr. Kate Campbell, and also from Matron Kerville. They are to visit the Training School two days in each term.

During May, in compliance with a request made by the British Medical Association, who arranged a course of post-graduate lectures and demonstrations for members of the profession and final year students, a lecture was given by the Medical Officer, Dr. Kate Campbell, and a demonstration was given by Matron Kerville on the Nursing Care of the

Premature Baby.

In May, a post-graduate course for obstetrical nurses was arranged by the Women's Hospital, and the Association was glad to be able to co-operate by providing the lectures in Mothercraft and Infant Welfare. Lectures and demonstrations were given in ante-natal and post-natal

work by Dr. Campbell and Matron Kerville.

The Council is pleased to report that there is now only about £800 owing on the building, which was erected at the end of 1928, and cost £9000. The Training School is under the supervision of Dr. Kate Campbell, and the Council thanks her for her great interest in the work. The Council is also grateful to Dr. Jean Macnamara for the excellent lectures she has given to the Sisters and the trainees on Infantile Paralysis.

Mrs. John Ross (Dr. Isabella Younger) attends an afternoon each week at the Queen Victoria Hospital, where the Association's trainees attend and receive valuable in-

struction in ante-natal care.

Many visitors from Victoria and other States have visited the School, and expressed appreciation of the Association's work. Several of the local Committees have also taken a great interest, and the members of the Conference of the Australian Federation of Women Voters were entertained and shown over the School.

Miss Rhoda Strachan continues her work as Hon. Organiser of the Voluntary Helpers. During the year 42

Voluntary Helpers have taken the course. These young ladies are of the greatest assistance in the Centres, and their help is invaluable.

The Council sincerely thanks Miss Strachan for her

splendid co-operation.

CO-OPERATION.

The Council has again to record the cordial co-operation of other Societies and Institutions. The Sisters continue to attend each Saturday morning at the Children's Hospital, where lectures are given by Dr. Kate Campbell. Copies of these lectures are sent to the Sisters in the country districts, who much appreciate this opportunity of keeping in touch with the work of the city.

The Association wishes to express its gratitude to Professor Marshall Allan and Dr. G. Simpson for their much appreciated lectures on ante-natal work which they have delivered during the year to the Sisters in training.

The Women's and Queen Victoria Hospitals kindly allow the trainees to attend the ante-natal clinics, and this valu-

able instruction has been of the greatest benefit.

The Willsmere Milk Institute, Kindergarten Union, Association of Creches, District Nursing Society, Victorian Bush Nursing Association, Country Women's Association, and Benevolent Societies have greatly assisted in the work.

Talks on Mothercraft have been broadcasted throughout the year, and many grateful letters regarding these have been received from country mothers. Many lectures have been given to members of Mothers' Clubs, Domestic Arts Schools, Mothers' Unions, Girl Guides, and country organisations.

DAME JANET CAMPBELL.

The Association was delighted to welcome Dame Janet Campbell, who came from England at the invitation of the Commonwealth Government to report on Maternal and Infant Welfare. She generously gave a whole day to the Association. In the morning she visited the Training School, the Executive entertained her at luncheon at the Lyceum Club, and in the afternoon took her to visit several of the Centres; the Hawthorn Committee invited her and the Executive to afternoon tea.

All the members of the Association had the privilege of hearing Dame Janet Campbell at an evening meeting at the Melbourne Town Hall, at which the President, Sir

George Cuscaden, presided.

LECTURING SISTER.

In May last Sister Violet Phillips resigned her position

as Lecturing Sister. Sister Colvin was appointed.

The work in the schools during the year has been most successful. Lectures have been given to the senior girls at the following State Schools:—Dorcas Street, South Melbourne; Burnley; Brighton Street, Richmond; Windsor; Westgarth; Hawthorn West; Victoria Park; Napier Street, Fitzroy; Nott Street, Port Melbourne; Heidelberg; Ivanhoe; Fairfield Park; St. Kilda; Albert Park; Middle Park; Fawkner Park; Peel Street, Kew; East Kew; Thornbury; Lee Street, Carlton; Cambridge Street, Collingwood; Glenferrie; South Auburn, Falconer Street.

Lectures have also been given at Box Hill Girls' Technical School, Essendon High School, Girls' High School at Mangarra Road, East Camberwell, Preston, Richmond, Montague, and Collingwood; Methodist Ladies College, "Fintona" Presbyterian Girls' Grammar School, "Firbank" Church of England Girls' Grammar School; and to second year students at the Kindergarten Training College, Kew.

The following Girl Guide Companies have received lectures:—Holy Advent, Armadale, Kew Rangers, Fitzroy Rangers, Girls' Friendly Society at Fairfield Park.

The following Mothers' Clubs have been visited:— Christ Church, Essendon; St. Luke's, South Melbourne; Cubitt Street, Richmond; Croydon; East Kew.

1129 schoolgirls sat for Infant Hygiene Examination. Of these canditates, 699 obtained 75 per cent. or over, and were granted the certificate.

During the year 278 Lectures have been given, and

136 Demonstrations.

In the country districts, several of the Centre Sisters,

where possible, give lectures in the schools.

The consideration and interest shown by the teachers at the schools is very much appreciated by the Association.

The Association has supplied the speaker for 3DB. Broadcasting Station on alternate Thursday mornings.

Lectures have been given by the Lecturing Sisters to the Midwifery trainees at St. George's Intermediate Hospital, Kew; and also by Matron Kerville at the Queen Victoria Hospital.

MUNICIPALITIES.

The splendid co-operation of the Municipalities is very much appreciated by the Association. They are always most sympathetic to the work, and have erected many fine buildings to ensure that the work may be carried out more effectively.

The Councillors individually take the greatest interest in their Centres, and are always ready to assist in every way. The work of the Newspaper Depot is being carried on in premises at 599 Little Lonsdale Street, under the management of Miss Cross, and is progressing satisfactorily. It is a source of revenue to the funds of the Association.

In May of this year Mrs. J. H. Dodds was granted leave of absence. Cr. G. B. Renfrey was then appointed a

Trustee.

The Council desires to thank Mrs. J. H. Dodds, Crs. J. A. Grant and G. B. Renfrey for their great assistance and interest.

FINANCE.

The Council desires to sincerely thank the Trustees of the Edward Wilson Estate for their very generous donations, which have, in a great measure, enabled the Association to maintain its Training School, and effectively carry out its propaganda work.

The Trustees of the Alfred Felton Estate have generously assisted the work, and the Council desires to express

its appreciation of their much valued assistance.

The Trustees of the H. V. McKay Trust most generously donated £200, to be used for country work, and £200 was also received from the Trustees Alfred Edment's Trust.

The Council sincerely thanks the Sisters of the Association for their loyal and faithful service, without which it would be impossible to carry on so successfully the work for the welfare of the Mothers and Babies of Victoria.
