AIMS AND OBJECTS OF THE **ASSOCIATION**

- (1) To safeguard the health of mothers and babies, by the spread of knowledge of the laws of health.
- (2) To encourage the breast-feeding of infants.
- (3) To employ trained nurses, who shall:—
 - (a) Attend certain centres, where not only mothers with their babies can come, but also expectant mothers.
 - (b) Visit mothers at their homes, and help them carry out simple hygienic rules.
- (4) To hold meetings and give organised teaching to women, as opportunity shall arise, and to disseminate such knowledge by every available agency.
- (5) To co-operate with all present or future organisations working for the same objects.

The objects of the Association being to keep infants healthy, sick children are not treated at Centre, but are always referred to their own doctor, or to a hospital.

Thirteenth Annual Report

Ladies and Gentlemen,-

In presenting the Thirteenth Annual Report, the Council draws attention to the fact that, while its report gives a general survey of the Association's work, each Health Centre publishes its own Annual Report and Balance Sheet, manages its own affairs, and extends the work in its own district.

The Balance Sheet at the end of this pamphlet is for the Central Council and the Training School only.

ADMINISTRATION.

The Council has met every month, and the Executive Committee, consisting of office-bearers, nine members of Council, of whom two at least must be representatives of Municipal Councils, and which is elected annually by the Council to co-ordinate the work, has met at frequent intervals. The finance is controlled by a sub-committee, a Training School Committee, and a medical sub-committee deals with all technical matters in connection with the training of Nurses and the conduct of Baby Health Centres generally.

GENERAL PROGRESS.

During the year the work has progressed very satisfactorily, and attendances at the Centres have increased. The help and advice given to the Mothers for themselves and for their babies is much appreciated.

The Maryborough Council has erected a very fine Centre building, towards the cost of which the sum of £359 was raised by the Ladies' Committee.

The new Centre erected at Hopetoun Park, Geelong, is in an ideal position. This Centre was opened entirely free from debt, the Ladies of the Committee contributing towards the cost of building and furnishings. They are to be congratulated on such splendid results.

The new rooms provided by the South Melbourne City Council for its Centre at the Town Hall were officially opened by Her Excellency, Lady Somers, on October 28.

New Centre buildings have also been erected at Oakleigh, Ormond, Surrey Hills, and South Camberwell.

A new Centre has been opened at East Ballarat; the Sister who has been appointed to this Centre will visit adjoining shires where sub-Centres are being opened. A sub-Centre has been opened at North Wonthaggi.

The Heidelberg Shire Council has agreed to the appointment of a third Sister and is now awaiting the Government Grant.

The Association had its Centre at the Agricultural Show, where many mothers called for advice and to have their babies weighed.

The Council desires to express its thanks to Messrs. Myers Pty. Ltd., who generously lent the furnishings for this occasion.

RESIDENTIAL TRAINING SCHOOL AND MOTHERCRAFT HOME.

The Council is pleased to report that the work at the Training School has been very successful, and thanks are due to Matron Kerville, who has carried out her duties so efficiently. The Mothercraft Home has accommodation for two mothers and eight babies. The accommodation has been fully occupied and there is always a waiting list. During the year, 74 babies (including 16 prematures) and 27 Mothers with breast-fed babies have been admitted. Twenty-nine Sisters (six trainees of the Victorian Bush Nursing Association) have taken this post-graduate course.

Attention is drawn to the Refresher Course for Baby Health Centre Nurses, which is held at the Training School. Already, seven Sisters-in-Charge of Centres have taken the Course, which is now residential, and many other applications have been received. Thanks are due to the local Committees, who are co-operating and offering facilities to the Sisters undertaking this Course. A Certificate is being issued at the completion of Refresher Course. In connection with a post-graduate course for obstetrical Nurses, arranged by the Women's Hospital in November last, lectures and demonstrations were given in ante-natal and post-natal work by Dr. Kate Campbell and Matron Kerville, at the Association's Training School. have been issued to the Sisters-in-Charge of Centres.

Twenty-seven Medical Students have attended at the Training School for two days' practical instruction and lectures.

At the request of Dr. Fitzgerald, of the Education Department, the Association was pleased to arrange for a course of lectures and demonstrations in Mothercraft and Infant Welfare to be given to students of the Teachers' Training College at the Training School by Matron Kerville. Forty Girl Guides of the Brunswick and Moreland Guide Companies attended at the Training School for a Course of Lectures and Demonstrations.

During the year 40 Voluntary Helpers have received their training, and have proved of the greatest assistance in many of the Centres.

Miss Rhoda Strachan still continues to act as Hon. Organiser of the Voluntary Helpers, and the Council desires to thank her for her active interest in this branch of the work, which is very much appreciated.

The Training School is under the supervision of Dr. Kate Campbell, and the Council thanks her for her great interest in the work.

The Council is also grateful to Dr. Jean Macnamara for the lectures she has given to the Sisters and trainees on Infantile Paralysis.

Dr. Younger Ross attends at the Queen Victoria Hospital, where the Association's trainees receive valuable instruction in ante-natal care.

CO-OPERATION.

The Council has again to record the cordial co-operation of other Societies and Institutions. The Sisters attend each Saturday morning at the Children's Hospital, where lectures are given by Dr. Kate Campbell and others. Copies of these lectures are sent to the Sisters in the country districts, who much appreciate this opportunity of keeping in touch with the work of the city.

The Association wishes to express its gratitude to Professor Marshall Allan for his great interest and cooperation in the work; also to Dr. G. Simpson, for his much appreciated lectures on ante-natal work, which he has delivered during the year to the Sisters in training, and Dr. Isabel Ireland for her lectures to the trainees. Thanks are also due to the examiners, Drs. Kincaid, Simpson and Boyd Graham.

The Women's and Queen Victoria Hospitals kindly allow the trainees to attend the ante-natal clinics, and this valuable instruction has been of the greatest benefit.

The Willsmere Milk Institute, Kindergarten Union, Association of Creches, District Nursing Society, Victorian Bush Nursing Association, Country Women's Association, and Benevolent Societies have greatly assisted in the work.

The Association is co-operating with the Government in connection with special grant for purchase of food for babies and expectant mothers, by arranging for Sisters-in-Charge of Centres to give information to the organisation distributing the relief, as to the type of food suitable to be given.

Arrangements have been made with the Children's Welfare Department for all State Wards under 2 years of age to attend the Centres.

Talks on Mothercraft have been broadcasted throughout the year, and many grateful letters regarding these have been received from country mothers. Many lectures have been given to members of Mothers' Clubs, Domestic Arts Schools, Mothers Unions, Girl Guides, and country organisations.

HON. SECRETARY.

Mrs. C. O. White, Hon. Secretary of the Association, is visiting England and will represent the Association at the Conference of the National Council for Maternity and Child Welfare.

We regret very much Mrs. White's absence this year and trust she will return to us soon. Her great interest in the work has had much to do with the success of the movement.

Mrs. D. A. Skene and Mrs. W. J. Boyland were appointed to act as joint Hon. Secretaries during Mrs. White's absence.

LECTURING SISTER.

The work of the Lecturing Sister has been most successful. Lectures have been given to the senior girls at the following State Schools:—South Melbourne; Hawthorn Central; Burnley; South Richmond; Balaciava Central; Westgarth Central; Victoria Park; Auburn Central; Fairfield; Heidelberg; George Street, Fitzroy; Albert Park; Middle Park; Northcote; Hawthorn; Manningtree Road, Thornbury; Falconer Street Central; East Kew; Kew; Lee Street, Carlton; Collingwood and Elwood Central.

Lectures have also been given at Box Hill Girls' Technical School, Essendon High School, Camberwell Girls' School, Girls' High Schools at Richmond, Preston, Collingwood, South Melbourne, Methodist Ladies' College, "Firbank" Church of England Girls' Grammar School, Brighton, "Fintona" Presbyterian Girls' Grammar School, Camberwell, and at the Kindergarten Training College, Kew.

1633 school girls sat for Infant Hygiene Examination. Of these, candidates 785 obtained 75 per cent. marks or over, and were granted the certificate.

During the year 260 lectures have been given and 176 demonstrations.

In many of the country districts, lectures are given in the schools by the Centre Sisters.

The consideration and interest shown by the teachers in the schools is very much appreciated by the Association.

The following Mothers' Clubs have been visited:—Fitzroy Free Kindergarten; St. Luke's C. of E., South Melbourne; South Richmond; East Malvern; Abbotsford; Caulfield; also at the Girls' Club, Baptist Church, Richmond.

Companies of Girl Guides at St. Kilda, East St. Kilda and Balwyn have received instruction in Mothercraft, and all were successful in the examinations.

Three courses, each comprising seven lectures, have been given during the year to the Midwifery Trainees of St. George's Intermediate Hospital. Lectures have also been given to the Midwifery Trainees at the Queen Victoria Hospital by Matron Kerville. The lectures at the Queen Victoria Hospital will, in future, be given by one of the two Sisters, recently appointed to the Staff, who received their training in Mothercraft and Infant Welfare at the Association's Training School.

MUNICIPALITIES.

The Association very much appreciates the splendid co-operation of the Municipalities. They have erected many fine buildings to ensure that the work may be carried out more effectively.

The Councillors, who represent the various Municipalities on the Council of the Association, are very regular in attending the meetings, and their interest and valuable assistance is much appreciated.

The work of the Newspaper Depot is being carried on in premises at 495 Spencer Street, West Melbourne, under the management of Miss Cross, and is progressing satisfactorily. It is a source of revenue to the funds of the Association.

The Council desires to thank Mrs. J. H. Dodds, Crs. J. A. Grant and G. B. Renfrey, for their great assistance in connection with the Depot, and to all those who so generously save their newspapers for the Association.

FINANCE.

The Council desires to thank the Trustees of the Edward Wilson Estate for their very generous donations, which have been of the greatest assistance to the work of the Association.
