 - (b) Visit mothers at their homes, and help them carry out simple hygienic rules.
 - (4) To hold meetings and give organised teaching to women, as opportunity shall arise, and to disseminate such knowledge by every available agency.
 - (5) To co-operate with all present or future organisations working for the same objects.

The objects of the Association being to keep infants healthy, sick children are not treated at Centre, but are always referred to their own doctor, or to a hospital.

Fourteenth Annual Report

Ladies and Gentlemen,—

In presenting the Fourteenth Annual Report, the Council draws attention to the fact that, while its report gives a general survey of the Association's work, each Health Centre publishes its own Annual Report and Balance Sheet, manages its own affairs, and extends the work in its own district.

The Balance Sheet at the end of this pamphlet is for the Central Council and the Training School only.

ADMINISTRATION.

The Council has met every month, and the Executive Committee, consisting of office-bearers, nine members of Council, of whom two at least must be representatives of Municipal Councils, and which is elected annually by the Council to co-ordinate the work, has met at frequent intervals. The finance is controlled by a sub-committee, a Training School Committee, and a medical sub-committee deals with all technical matters in connection with the training of Nurses and the conduct of Baby Health Centres generally.

GENERAL PROGRESS.

The work of the Centres has progressed satisfactorily during the year, although there have been many difficulties to contend with, owing to the reduction of the Government Grant.

A new Sub-Centre has been opened at Monbulk and is progressing satisfactorily.

It is hoped to extend the work of the Castlemaine Centre to Maldon, where a Sub-Centre is contemplated.

A new Centre building has been erected at Canterbury and is shortly to be opened.

At Bendigo, a Mothers' Club has been formed, which is co-operating with the Baby Health Centre Committee and is doing splendid work.

The Voluntary Helpers at the Essendon Baby Health Centre have formed a Younger Set to help the Centres in that district.

A very successful card party was organised by the Sister-in-Charge and Voluntary Helpers of the Heidelberg and Ivanhoe Centres, which enabled them to purchase a set of scales for each of the two Centres.

A Memorial Gate has been erected at the Croydon Baby Health Centre in memory of the late Sister Chalmers, who was in charge of that Centre until her death.

The Association had its Centre at the Agricultural Show as usual. The Sisters were able to get in touch with many country mothers who called for advice and for patterns of infants' clothing.

After the first decade of Infant Welfare work in Victoria the vital statistics show a marked decrease in deaths of infants under one year of age, which is attributable, and is acknowledged to be so attributable by the Government Statistician, to this Branch of Infant Welfare work which is being carried out in the community, and of which the permanent results are now beginning to show. The death rate of infants under one year of age per 1000 births has fallen from 73.8 in 1915 to 46.5 in 1930.

During the time of depression the need for the Centres is greater than ever, and is shown by the increased attendances. The work of the Sisters is also increased by the co-operation with the Government in connection with the special sustenance allowance for expectant and nursing mothers and infants. The Sisters recommend the cases and give information to the organisations distributing relief as to the type of food necessary to be given. The grant has been a great boon to the mothers and babies suffering from lack of nutrition.

RESIDENTIAL TRAINING SCHOOL AND MOTHERCRAFT HOME.

The work of the Training School has been very successful, and thanks are due to Matron Kerville for the very efficient manner in which she has carried out her duties.

Lady Irvine visited the Mothercraft Home and Training School in December last and expressed her interest in the work.

Admissions to the Mothercraft Home during the year were:—Mothers with breast-fed babies 33, premature babies 13, artificially-fed babies 40.

Twenty-six Sisters have received their Mothercraft and Infant Welfare training during the year at the Training School and all were successful in the examinations. Eight

Sisters in Charge of Centres have taken the Refresher Course, which lasts two weeks.

On the third Saturday in each month the Sisters in Charge of Centres attend a lecture at the Training School given by Dr. Campbell, the Association's Medical Officer.

Medical Students, numbering 18, received two days' lectures and demonstrations in Infant Welfare. Forty-five Voluntary Helpers have attended a course of lectures, and 32 Girl Guides received instruction in Infant Welfare and sat for examination at the Training School. Special lectures have been given to Teachers from the Teachers' Training College and to Students of the Emily McPherson College of Domestic Economy.

A very important development in the work of the Training School is taking place. In the Diploma of Gynaecology and Obstetrics instituted by the University, six lectures and demonstrations in Infant Welfare are considered to be essential and are now included in the curriculum, and at the request of Professor Marshall Allan it has been arranged for these lectures and demonstrations to be given at the Training School by the Association's Medical Officer and the Matron. It is felt that this is a distinct recognition of the value of the work placed upon it by the University.

Through the kindness of the Acting Director of the Education Department (Mr. McRae), arrangements have been made for a course of instruction in voice production and public speaking to be given to the trainees of the Association. The Council is very appreciative of the value of this tuition and wishes to thank Miss McCoppin, who is in charge of the classes.

The Council is very grateful to the members of "Toc H" who cleared and planted the land adjoining the Training School. Soil and seeds were kindly given by the Melbourne City Council. The grass is beginning to grow and is a great improvement to the building.

At the suggestion of Matron Kerville a bridge party was held at the Training School in May last, which proved very successful; with the proceeds a supply of linen was purchased for the Mothercraft Home.

The Council wishes to thank Miss Rhoda Strachan, Hon. Organiser of the Voluntary Aid Detachment, which supplies trained assistance to the Sisters in the Centres. Her work is very much appreciated, and the Voluntary Helpers render invaluable assistance at the Centres.

Dr. Kate Campbell supervises the Mothercraft Home and Training School, and the Council wishes to place on record her efficiency and great interest in the work. It is a matter of gratification to the Association that during the year Professor Marshall Allan has appointed Dr. Campbell to assist him in the Infant Welfare section of his work at the Women's Hospital.

Dr. Younger Ross attends at the Queen Victoria Hospital, where the Association's trainees receive invaluable instruction in ante-natal work.

CO-OPERATION.

The Council wishes to express its gratitude to Professor Marshall Allan for his interest and co-operation in the work; also to Dr. George Simpson for his valuable lectures to the trainees on ante-natal work, and to Dr. Isabel Ireland for the lectures she has given each term. Thanks are also due to the examiners, Drs. Kincaid, Stokes, Simpson, Derham and Boyd Graham.

The Willsmere Milk Institute, Kindergarten Home, Association of Creches, District Nursing Society, Victorian Bush Nursing Association, and Benevolent Society have greatly assisted in the work. The Country Women's Association is co-operating with the Association in connection with the establishment of Centres in country districts.

HON. SECRETARY.

Mrs. C. O. White, Hon. Secretary of the Association, has been granted extension of leave until the end of the year. We look forward to her return to us and to the work which she has done so much to promote.

CR. AND MRS. J. D. HOWIE.

The Council regrets that owing to the fact that Cr. and Mrs. Howie are leaving Melbourne they will be obliged to sever their connection with the Association. Cr. Howie has been a very active member of the Executive and Council for some years and has been untiring in his efforts to bring the claims of the Association before the public. Mrs. Howie has always interested herself in the work of the Centres. Their loss will be felt by the Association. We wish them every happiness in their new home.

LECTURING SISTER.

The work of the Lecturing Sister has been very successful and is regarded as invaluable to the outlook of the future mothers of the State. This work is free of all charge to the schools and organisations visited. The Sister is paid from the all too limited funds of the Association, no Government assistance being allotted to this valuable work.

Lectures have been given to the senior girls at the following State Schools:—South Melbourne, Burnley, Hawthorn, South Richmond, Glenhuntly, Balaclava Central, Westgarth Central, Malvern East Central, Deepdene Central, Victoria Park, Windsor, Fitzroy, Port Melbourne, St. Kilda Park, Ivanhoe, Fairfield, Heidelberg, Auburn Central, George Street Fitzroy, Albert Park, Middle Park, Thornbury, Falconer Street Central, East Kew Central, Kew, Lee Street Carlton, Collingwood, and Elwood.

Lectures have also been given at Domestic Arts Schools at Richmond, Collingwood, East Camberwell, Preston, South Melbourne, and at Box Hill Technical School and Essendon High School. At "Fintona" Presbyterian Girls' Grammar School, the Methodist Ladies' College, Kindergarten Training College, Emily McPherson College of Domestic Economy, and the midwifery trainees of St. George's Intermediate Hospital.

Lectures were given at the following Mothers' Clubs:—Free Kindergartens, Little Cremorne Street, Richmond, and Abbotsford; East Kew Central School Mothers' Club, Caulfield Central, Presbyterian Mothers' Union, and at St. Stephen's, Balaclava.

A course of ten lectures has been given to the Girls' Friendly Society, Holy Trinity Church, Hampton, and six lectures to members of the Girls' Club, Surrey Hills. Lectures were also given to the following Guide Companies:—Moreland, Carlton and Brunswick, Hawthorn and District, and "St. Catherine's" Girls' School.

A lecture was given to the members of the Victorian Association of Creches during the year.

Talks on Mothercraft have been broadcasted throughout the year. Many letters from listeners-in were received and answered.

During the year 288 lectures have been given and 192 demonstrations. Nine hundred and eighty-two certificates were awarded to schoolgirls who were successful in the examination.

The Council appreciates the interest and consideration shown by the teachers in the schools in connection with the lectures.

STATE GOVERNMENT.

A deputation arranged by the Municipal Association of Victoria, consisting of representatives of Municipal Councils and members of this Association, waited upon the Assistant Minister of Health, the Hon. D. L. MacNamara, M.L.C., in order to put before him the position of the Centres in connection with the reduction of Government Grant.

The Minister was in sympathy with the deputation and stated that there would be no further reduction for the present. When the financial state of the country improves consideration will be given to a restoration of payments.

MUNICIPALITIES.

The splendid co-operation of the Municipalities is very much appreciated by the Association. They are always sympathetic to the work, and, in addition to paying their share of the grant—£ for £ with the Government—they have erected many fine buildings to ensure that the work may be carried out more effectively. The Councillors individually take great interest in their Centres and are always ready to assist in every possible way.

NEWSPAPER DEPOT.

The work of the Newspaper Depot has been severely handicapped owing to the difficulty in obtaining supplies of paper. Several large orders have had to be refused, and in consequence the amount handed over to Association funds is considerably less than in previous years.

We desire to thank those who have so kindly saved papers for the Association in the past, and would like to take this opportunity of asking them to continue to help us in this way, as the papers are very urgently needed; the reduction of contributions from Trust funds makes it more imperative that the income received from the Newspaper Depot should be well maintained.

The Council thanks the Trustees of the Newspaper Depot, Mrs. J. H. Dodds and Cr. J. A. Grant, for their great interest and assistance.

FINANCE.

The Council desires to thank the Trustees of the Edward Wilson Estate, Alfred Felton Estate and Alfred Edments Trust for their generous donations, which have been of the greatest assistance to the work.

The Trustees of the J. C. McPherson Trust, Henry Gyles Turner Samaritan Fund, David Syme Charitable Trust, Stanley Heath Fund, T. J. Sumner Trust, Sir Wm. Austin Zeal Estate, Walter and Eliza Hall Trust, Kew City Council, St. Kilda City Council, and Mr. E. Truby Williams are all gratefully thanked for their donations.

The Council wishes to thank the Hon. Solicitors, Messrs. Moule, Hamilton & Derham, for their valuable assistance, and the Melbourne Tramways Board for allowing tickets to be purchased for the Sisters whilst on duty at a reduced rate.

A special tribute must be paid to the Sisters in Charge of Centres who have carried on the increased work so splendidly. The Council sincerely thanks them for the loyal services they have rendered.
