

# AIMS AND OBJECTS OF THE ASSOCIATION



- 1. To safeguard the health of mothers and babies.
- 2. To encourage the breast feeding of infants.
- 3. To equip and maintain a Hospital and Babies Home, and Infant Welfare and Mothercraft Training School, with Model Baby Health Centre for:
  - (a) The special training of Infant Welfare Sisters and Mothercraft Nurses.
  - (b) The provision of education for mothers with a view to enabling them to bring up their children in accordance with modern health principles.
  - (c) The provision of accommodation for the education and care of mothers and babies, especially nursing mothers, and for difficult, delicate or premature babies who may require special investigation and expert care in regard to their rearing, and so that where mothers in poor, necessitous or destitute circumstances are so accommodated and maintained, the Association shall contribute towards their upkeep from its funds received voluntarily for the purpose.
- 4. To co-operate with School and other authorities in giving teaching to classes of school girls and young women with the view of gaining their sympathy and interest in the proper care and nurture of babies and young children.
- 5. To arrange for organised teaching to women on the care of the-
  - (a) expectant mother,
  - (b) the mother, and
  - (c) children,

and to disseminate such knowledge by every available means.

 To co-operate with all present or future organisations working for the same objects.

#### FIFTIETH ANNUAL REPORT

Ladies and Gentlemen.

I have the honour of presenting to you the 50th Annual Report of this Association which conducts the Queen Eliabeth Hospital for Mothers and Babies for the purpose of training Infant Welfare Sisters and Mothercraft Nurses, also caring for mothers needing help with the care and management of babies and young children, as well as some Social Welfare children.

In conjunction with this work the Association conducts and maintains a Baby Health Centre at 96 Keppel Street.

#### ADMINISTRATION

Administration is carried out by an Executive Committee, Finance Committee and House Committee together with the Council, The Executive Committee meets each month working in close co-operation with the Matron (Miss Buxton) very ably assisted by its Medical Officers who act in an honorary capacity devoting many hours to the care of the Welfare children and giving helpful advice upon the running of the Hospital and its Baby Health Centre.

#### LADY CURTIS

We are fortunate in having Lady Curtis, as our President. who is so well known to you all, and to whom we are most grateful for her interest and enthusiasm throughout the year.

#### **OBITUARIES**

At the end of July in the financial year under review the Association lost one of its most enthusiastic and valued supporters in the passing of Dr. Doris Officer, O.B.E.

It is with deep regret we record the death of Dr. Cash, who had given lectures on dental care to the trainees and Health Centre.

#### RETIREMENT

Miss M. G. Lummis retired after 41 years' service with the Association.

#### GENERAL

The Association was established in 1917 by the late Dr. Isabel Younger Ross and was responsible for establishing so many of the Baby Health Centres throughout this State of Victoria. However, this work has now mainly outgrown the capacity of a voluntary organisation and so we work as closely as possible with the Maternal and Child Welfare Section of the Department of Health. From time to time we are able to help Centres with a small subsidy towards purchase of equipment; the funds for this work have been bequeathed to us for this purpose.

The Association continues to interest itself by affiliation with other voluntary organizations interested in promoting legislative reform necessary for safeguarding the health of mothers and children and other child welfare work. In these more modern times we are a little sad to see the Ladies' Baby Health Centre Committees disappearing, the disrupting of the good liaison which such committees have been able to maintain between Sister in charge and the local Municipal Council. This no longer exists, but, if this is progress, then we cannot hinder it but go along with the new concept of the work.

The pioneering work done by these committees in establishing Centres in this State should not be forgotten. One wonders how many young mothers of today have any idea of the barriers and prejudices which have been overcome to establish the Centres. They take this for granted. Can they realise how much they have been saved by the overcoming of sickness, infectious diseases, anxiety, faulty feeding, etc.? In the first instance the vision and wisdom of one woman whose motto was: "Learn from the past, work for the present and plan for the future."

#### ACTIVITIES

The Association continues to make its Hall available to the Nursing Mothers' Association for meetings but no member has been able to attend any of the meetings during this year. Mrs. Rivers Dickinson and Mrs. Stephens attended and represented the Association at an annual Baby Health Centre meeting held at Croydon. The Association was represented at the opening of a new Centre at Shepparton.

Mesdames Stephens, Ibbott, Taylor and Cr. Sinclair were invited to a Meeting of the Richmond Baby Health Centre (which was the first Baby Health Centre built in Victoria), after which a plaque to the memory of Dr. Doris Officer was unveiled, Mrs. Stephens also attended the annual meeting held at Caulfield.

#### "BABY HEALTH"

It was decided to discontinue printing this magazine after the March issue. The magazine had been in circulation for 20 years and during that time only one year did it make a profit. It was considered that we could no longer cope with the drain on our finances.

#### APPRECIATION

To the Hospitals and Charities Commission I have reason to be particularly grateful for courteous advice regarding office problems, building repairs, as well as financial support and the regular arrival of Government subsidy — it has been most encouraging during this difficult vear.

To our legal advisers, Messrs. Moule, Hamilton & Derham, but in particular Mr. Hudson and Mr. Alley, we extend our very sincere thanks for their help and guidance so freely given in an honorary capacity.

To Mrs. W. C. Taylor, who has given her services in an honorary capacity also, and has done a wonderful job in writing up the books and straightening out the accounts.

We were pleased to welcome Dr. Mabin to the Committee during the year and wish to express our gratitude to him for his help.

To our Surrey Hills Auxiliary we extend grateful thanks for their gifts of equipment and money raised for the Hospital.

The "Biralee" Group has given us a very nice "Acme" cot, besides other gifts and we wish them well in their work for the Hospital. Thank vou. Biralee.

To the Pied Pipers, another energetic young group working for a new refrigerator for the kitchen, we extend our grateful thanks and wish

them every success with their work, To Mr. W. Howard and the Businessmen's Committee we offer our

most sincere thanks for the splendid job they have done during the past 15 years in raising over \$100,000 for the Q.E. Hospital.

#### QUEEN ELIZABETH HOSPITAL FOR MOTHERS AND BABIES MATRON'S REPORT

During the year cases of tonsilitis, chicken pox and virus infection kept the Sisters busy in the Nursery. These cases were ably taken care of by Dr. Wadds. The nurses also suffered with the influenza virus.

Many babies were accepted in the Nursery Wing during the year and received expert attention and care. Mothers also in need of rest and advice were in residence and expressed their appreciation of the

wonderful help given to them.

Infant Welfare lectures and demonstrations were held and many Sisters completed their Infant Welfare Training. Refresher courses were also held and these were well attended. Sister Weight obtained highest marks in the State Examination.

Sister Stott has been on long service leave for six months and has just returned to duty. She was ably relieved by Sister McCarthy.

The Tongala Bursary for Infant Welfare Sisters has been discon-

The Staff Amenities Fund Committee held two functions and have raised a total of \$156.65, which is for the purchase of special equipment for the hospital.

Heaters have been installed in the Nurses' bedrooms giving more comfort to the staff in residence. These heaters are controlled by a two-hour time switch. New line has been laid in the staff dining room and together with fresh painting the room now looks much brighter.

Matron's rooms have been redecorated and for this we extend our sincere thanks to Mr. Howard and his Businessmen's Committee.

Resulting from a party given by Mrs. Bloore new blinds have been provided for the staff bedrooms.

Since the catering has been taken over by the Nationwide Food Service, the kitchen has been functioning most satisfactorily and the meals have much improved.

Dr. Helen Byrne resigned as Doctor in Charge of Nursing Staff.

Dr. Roy Cash died during the year.

Dr. Woolcott has been appointed by Melbourne City Council in Dr. Cash's place and will give the Dental Lectures to the Students. This was arranged by Dr. K. Campbell.

Dr. Elizabeth Warr is now giving three lectures on the psychological aspect of infant care. She has replaced Mr. Cathcart who resigned during the year.

Dr. Howard Walker is giving the lectures on Pre Natal Care. He has replaced Dr. Marcia Robinson who resigned during the year.

Thirty-six Sisters completed training from 1/7/67 to 30/6/68. Eleven Mothercraft Nurses completed training from 1/7/67 to 30/6/68.

To Dr. Marjorie Wadds and Dr. Kate Campbell we wish to convey our special appreciation of their work for the babies in residence at the Hospital.

#### BABY HEALTH CENTRE QUEEN ELIZABETH HOSPITAL

The Sister-in-Charge, Sister P. Love, is not only responsible for the routine running of the Centre itself, but also for the practical training of the Infant Welfare Trainees who register with the Queen Elizabeth Hospital for Mothers and Babies for training in Centre work as well as for home visiting in the district and the usual monthly immunisation sessions. Sister also assists the doctor in charge of the Pre-Natal Clinic conducted at this Centre each week in conjunction with the Melbourne City Council.

The committee and members of the Association are most grateful to Sister for her excellent work during the year.

#### LECTURING SISTER

Mothercraft Lectures in schools were very ably conducted by Sister Burgess until her retirement at the end of Term I, 1968. To Sister Burgess we extend grateful thanks for a job well done, and offer congratulations upon the success of her work and with her happiness in her retirement.

We extend a warm welcome to Sister Bathgate who took up the duties of Lecturing Sister in schools at the beginning of Term II.

## ISABEL YOUNGER ROSS MEMORIAL HALL

During the year under review the Hall has been hired for lectures and conferences, but the demand for hiring has not reached expectations, also, due to rising costs of cleaning, we have been forced to increase charges for the hire of the Hall.

#### LECTURERS IN MOTHERCRAFT COUNTRY DISTRICTS

Many Sisters-in-Charge of Baby Health Centres in the country have given lectures to school girls in their districts. The Association congratulates these Sisters for their enterprise in undertaking this work.

#### STATE GOVERNMENT

The Association values the Government's continuance of the special grants to its Queen Elizabeth Infant Welfare Training School and the training of Mothercraft Nurses.

#### MUNICIPAL AND SHIRE COUNCILS

We are most grateful to the Melbourne City Council for the use of a room each month for the purpose of conducting our Council Meetings.

To all the Municipal and Shire Councils who continue to take an active interest in the Centres and in the extension of this service within their districts.

The Association is grateful to those Municipal Councils who support the work of its Queen Elizabeth Hospital with regular donations each year.

#### WASTEPAPER AND CARDBOARD APPEAL

The Association has continued to benefit each month by contributions received from the sale of waste paper, the collection being carried out by the "Hospitals and Charities Paper and Cardboard Appeal Committee".

The Association asks all those interested in helping its work to collect paper and cardboard, and make it available to the "Hospitals and Charities Paper and Cardboard Appeal" in which the Association shares.

#### FINANCE

The Council desires to thank all those who have so generously contributed financial support for its many Maternal and Child Welfare activities during the year. These donations have been of great benefit to the Association's work, and without this support the Association could not continue its work.

#### CONCLUSION

The Association records its thanks to the Matron and Staff of the Queen Elizabeth Hospital and the Sisters-in-Charge Baby Health Centre for their devoted services, which means so much to the welfare of the mothers and babies of Victoria.
