

At QEC, we want to share the things we have learned about what works (and what doesn't) to make it easy for everyone to do the very best thing for every child, family and community.


And we love it when they share what they have discovered with us too. We are passionate about what we do, but we are always looking for the best way to do things.




where to now?



Recently, QEC was pleased to welcome a strong commitment from the Victorian Government to further our work – with an undertaking to provide significant investment to expand Early Parenting Services across our state.

The Victorian Government has committed \$148 million to build a number of new Early Parenting Centres across Victoria enabling those in some of Australia's fastest growing communities, rural and regional areas to have better access to parenting supports.
